While the data is in a monthly format, this table is updated only quarterly. Data is available for all 33 of New Mexico's counties (does not include Statewide New Mexico, nor Albuquerque, Las Cruces or Santa Fe metropolitan areas.)

2003 Benchmark, Release March 14, 2004

Note: Employment is now categorized using the new North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). This system better measures today's economy and is a substantial improvement over the old SIC system. Many industries are similar to the old system, while others are unrecognizable. Under NAICS the emphasis is on services and information, rather than manufacturing. NAICS better reflects the jobs in New Mexico and the rest of the country. Statewide and area employment is grouped under NAICS super sectors. The trade, transportation & utilities super sector is expanded into three expanded super sectors, making a total of 12 industries statewide, plus government employment. Only 11 private industries are shown for the metropolitan areas of the state, because natural resources and mining is combined with construction, to meet minimum size requirements for publication. These summary industries are similar to the industry divisions under the old SIC system. The expanded super sectors and government add to total nonagricultural employment, however industry detail below the super sector level, does not necessarily add to the super sector level. The reason for this is that only industries large enough to meet established statistical sampling standards for reliability and confidentiality are published.

Quarterly Census of Employment And Wages

Census of employment includes employees covered under the New Mexico Unemployment Compensation Law (UI). Exclusions from UI coverage include such activities as insurance and real estate agents paid on a commission basis; services performed for a school, college or university by a student enrolled and attending classes at that institution; services performed in the employment of a church or convention or association of churches; and services performed in agricultural labor when the employing unit does not meet the employment and payroll requirements for coverage.

Below the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages files are in the PDF format and Excel. The industry codes used after 2000 are from the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). Prior to 2001 the industry code system used was the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC). Recently, historical data back to 1990 was released from the Bureau of Labor and Statistics in the NAICS codes.
